OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS OF THE MCHENRY COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

August 1, 2017

9:00 AM

Chairman Medalen called the meeting to order. Commissioners Harry Bergstad, David Medalen, Gregg Boutilier, Larry Haman and Bryan Bruner were present.

A motion was made by Boutilier and seconded by Bruner to approve the July 6th and 24th minutes. Motion carried unanimously.

Blade operators Kelly Brandt, Mike Volk, Brian Vollmer, Jerry Hansen, Neil Kitzman and John Bossert joined the meeting along with Kelly McCollam from DMC Wear Parts. McCollam explained how to properly use these cutting edges and placement of the mowboard. McCollam stated sometimes there is a need to not blade, especially when it's dry, as it just wastes money. He claims his cutting edges should have a fuel savings of approximately 40%.

The board received a request for funds from the YWCA in Minot. The board will request an opinion from the States Attorney.

The board reviewed the following zoning applications: variance application from Nicholas Brobst to place a second non-farm dwelling in the SE ¼ SE ¼ of Section 5-155-78; a variance application from Bethlehem Lutheran Church to add on to an existing structure which would be 115' from the center of 16th Ave N in the SW ¼ SW ¼ of Section 19-159-79; a variance application to construct a grain bin 104' from the center of 76th St N in the NW ¼ NE ¼ of Section 15-158-80; an amendment to change the zoning district from agricultural to recreational for property described as Outlots 594 and 832 in Section 17-153-80 and Outlots 595 and 833 in Section 18-153-80; a variance application from Justin Ronyak to place a home 80 feet from the center of the section line and a polebarn 90 feet from the center of the section line on the East side of the NE ¼ in Outlot 681 of Section 12-151-80. A motion was made by Bergstad and seconded by Haman to approve all zoning permits. Motion carried unanimously.

The public hearing was held to close the section line that lies between Sections 31 and 32 in 159-77. No one appeared in opposition. A motion was made by Bruner and seconded by Bergstad to approve closing this section line. Motion carried unanimously.

The public hearing was held to close the section line between sections 25 and 26 in 153-80. No one appeared in opposition. A motion was made by Bergstad and seconded by Bruner to approve closing this section line. Motion carried unanimously.

A motion was made by Medalen and seconded by Haman to appoint Bryan Bruner as the NDACo delegate for 2017-2019, as elected by the county officials. Motion carried. Bruner abstained.

A motion was made by Boutilier and seconded by Bergstad to approve the contract for the no load test with Otis. Motion carried unanimously.

A motion was made by Boutilier and seconded by Bruner to approve abatement #1259. Motion carried unanimously.

A request was received from the McHenry County Historical Society for the \$5,000 budgeted on their behalf. A motion was made by Haman and seconded by Bergstad to pay this out as previously budgeted. Motion carried unanimously.

A change order request was received from Dig It Up Backhoe for an additional \$7,500 due to unforeseen costs. A motion was made by Bergstad and seconded by Haman to deny the change order. Motion carried unanimously.

A motion was made by Haman and seconded by Medalen to advertise for bids to remove the logjams in several bridges. Motion carried unanimously.

A request was received from Towner City to mow the railroad right-of-way within city limits. Commissioner Haman will look into this.

Kent Indvik met with the board to provide an update on the county road projects.

Bill Behling with Meadowlark Wind met with the board to present an update on the wind project in the SW corner of the county.

Kelsey Siegler and a representative from Jamestown Communications joined the meeting. The bids were opened for the siren project. Bids were received from Jamestown Communications in the amount of \$169,960 and Federal Warning Systems of \$150,156.23. A motion was made by Bergstad and seconded by Boutilier to accept the low bid from Federal Warning Systems. Motion carried unanimously.

Jon Oksendahl and Maynard Peterson with RDO Equipment met with the board regarding the expiration of some JDLink subscriptions.

Travis Leier, DJ Randolph and Game & Fish representative John Mazur joined the meeting to provide information regarding the proposed plans for the Velva Wildlife Club.

The board recessed for lunch.

Kay Buri met with the board regarding the liability insurance for the Historical Society and questioned if they could fall under the county's policy.

Darwin Moen met with the commissioners regarding landowners neglecting to spray their spurge, wormwood, and other noxious weeds. The board recommended he meet with the weed board.

Helen Lehmann introduced her new Deputy Recorder, Renae Linstrom, to the board.

The board will be holding a special meeting on August 9th to work on the county budget.

A consent motion was made by Bergstad and seconded by Haman to approve the following receipts: Treasurer's Miscellaneous Receipts #41812-41897 the monthly payroll in the amount of \$162,411.44 paid by warrant checks #23713-23774 and Social Service bills totaling \$4,094.60; Clerk of Court July County fees \$650.73, State fees \$8,907.37; Sheriff July statement of fees \$770.75, Sheriffs mileage \$788.00; Deputy reports for June/July.

The board continued to audit bills until completed. It was then moved by Bruner and seconded by Medalen that the following bills be approved and the proper checks be issued thereof:
