OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS OF THE MCHENRY COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

June 5, 2018 9:00 AM

Chairman Medalen called the meeting to order. Commissioners David Medalen, Harry Bergstad, Larry Haman, Bryan Bruner and Gregg Boutilier were present. Also in attendance was Josh Frey.

A motion was made by Bruner and seconded by Haman to approve the April 25^{th} and May 1^{st} minutes. Motion carried unanimously.

RDO Representatives Jon Oksendahl and Brad Murphy briefly met with the board.

Josh Frey presented the board with his States Attorney opinion regarding the deposit of funds retained by the Sheriff's Department.

A motion was made by Bergstad and seconded by Bruner to approve the low bid from Asphalt Surface Technologies Corp. in the amount of \$332,808.32 to place a seal coat on 14 miles of pavement East and South of Velva. Motion carried unanimously.

A motion was made by Bergstad and seconded by Bruner to issue the proper deed to Sarah J. Kaylor, Jonathan W. Kaylor, Andrew T. Huwe and Matthew J. Huwe for the sale of county land described as Lots 11 and 12 of Block 12 in Original Bantry, and to cancel any remaining taxes. Motion carried unanimously. Boutilier absent.

A motion was made by Bruner and seconded by Haman to accept the proposal from ABM for a used copy machine. Motion carried unanimously.

A motion was made by Boutilier and seconded by Bergstad to approve the utility permit for Verendrye Electric to bore under Co Rd 18 in Section 11-156-77. Motion carried unanimously.

A notice was received from Towner City informing the county they are in violation of city ordinance 3.0105 Duty of Owner to Maintain. The city is requiring the county to repair the sidewalk in front of the county nurse's building. A motion was made by Boutilier and seconded by Bergstad to authorize Commissioner Haman to get it repaired. Motion carried unanimously.

A motion was made by Bergstad and seconded by Boutilier to appoint Commissioner Haman to the McHenry/Pierce Housing Authority Board. Motion carried unanimously.

The board discussed the additional workload the Veteran Service Officer is experiencing due to the number of contacts from Ward County veterans. The board will contact Ward County to discuss potential remedies for this problem.

The bids were opened for the road project on County Rd 1. Bids were received from Dirty Dog Digging, B & J Construction, Goodman Grading, and Farden Construction. A motion was made by Bergstad and seconded by Boutilier to accept the low bid from Farden Construction, pending it is Class 13 gravel. Motion carried unanimously.

The bids were opened for the road project on County Rd 2. Bids were received from Dirty Dog Digging, B & J Construction, Goodman Grading, and Farden Construction. A motion was made by Bruner and seconded by Bergstad to accept the low bid from Farden Construction, pending it is Class 13 gravel. Motion carried unanimously.

A motion was made by Bergstad and seconded by Haman, approving to clay and gravel in Red Cross Township. Motion carried unanimously.

Trey Skager joined the meeting. The board discussed department issues and the canine project.

The board recessed for lunch.

Kent Indvik met with the board to present project updates. A motion was made by Bergstad and seconded by Bruner to extend the chip seal project (SC-2500(018)) if it is approved by NDDOT. Motion carried unanimously.

Stacey Schmitt and Becki Freund joined the meeting.

A motion was made by Bruner and seconded by Haman to recess as a Board of Commissioners and convene as a Board of Equalization. Motion carried unanimously.

The board reviewed the city and township assessments. The board considered the following recommendations: Parcel 1-78 to remove the structural value since this property qualified for an FRE; Parcel 18-3586 to add \$28,400 true and full value as this property does not qualify for an FRE; Inundated land applications for N Bruce and Shawn Kaylor, Ole and Amy Bryn, and Dean Braasch. A motion was made by Boutilier and seconded by Haman to approve the inundated land applications. Motion carried unanimously. A motion was made by Boutilier and seconded by Haman to increase the agland values 7.5% to fall within the parameters required by the state. Motion carried unanimously. A motion was made by Bergstad and seconded by Bruner to approve the values as presented, including the FRE adjustments, for the city and township assessments. Motion carried unanimously.

A motion was made by Boutilier and seconded by Bruner to recess as a Board of Equalization and reorganize as a Board of Review for the unorganized townships. Motion carried unanimously. The board reviewed the assessments, farm residence exemptions and veteran's credits for the unorganized townships. A motion was made by Haman and seconded by Bergstad to approve the values, FRE's and veteran's credits. Motion carried unanimously.

A motion was made by Boutilier and seconded by Bergstad to reorganize as a Board of Equalization. Motion carried unanimously. A motion was made by Boutilier and seconded by Bruner to approve the assessments as presented for the unorganized townships. Motion carried unanimously. A motion was made by Boutilier and seconded by Bruner to adjourn as a Board of Equalization and reconvene as a Board of Commissioners. Motion carried unanimously.

The board conducted an interview with Vance Prellwitz for the County Road Supervisor position. A motion was made by Bergstad and seconded by Boutilier to offer the position to Vance. Motion carried unanimously.

A motion was made by Boutilier and seconded by Bruner to dispense with the requirement to mow the county ditches this summer due to the hay shortage. Commissioner Boutilier voting aye. Commissioners Medalen, Bruner, Haman, and Bergstad voting nay. Motion failed.

A motion was made by Bergstad and seconded by Boutilier to install a landline phone in the Karlsruhe county shop. Motion carried unanimously.

A consent motion was made by Haman and seconded by Bergstad to approve the following: Treasurer's Miscellaneous Receipts #42590-42675; the monthly payroll in the amount of \$151,781.30 paid by warrant checks #24325 – 24388 and Social Service bills totaling \$4,418.57; Clerk of Court Apr County fees \$598.25, State fees \$9,842.00; Clerk of Court May County fees \$575.99, State fees \$10,193.89; County Recorder April recording fees of \$12,849.00 and misc fees of \$672.57; County Recorder May recording fees of \$4,120.00 and misc fees of \$367.10; Sheriff's May statement of fees \$735.00, Sheriff's mileage \$629.00; Deputy reports for Mar/Apr/May.

The board continued to audit bills until completed. A motion was made by Bruner and seconded by Boutilier that the following bills be approved and the proper checks be issued thereof:
