## OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS OF THE MCHENRY COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

March 6, 2018

9:00 AM

Chairman Medalen called the meeting to order. Commissioners David Medalen, Larry Haman, Bryan Bruner and Gregg Boutilier were present. Commissioner Bergstad absent.

A motion was made by Haman and seconded by Boutilier to approve the February  $6^{th}$  minutes. Motion carried unanimously.

A motion was made by Boutilier and seconded by Haman to approve abatements 1270-1274, 1276, 1277. Motion carried unanimously.

A motion was made by Boutilier and seconded by Bruner to approve the raffle permit for the Velva Wildlife Club. Motion carried unanimously.

A motion was made by Bruner and seconded by Haman to sign the joint powers agreement with Souris Basin Planning Council for 2018. Motion carried unanimously.

Maynard Petersen from RDO met with the board regarding ClearPlex, a film placed on the maintainer windows to prevent breakage.

The board reviewed the variance and CUP application from Xcel Energy to place a temporary transmission line along the East side of 14th Ave N, between Hwy 97 and Hwy 52. The poles would be within the 150' setback requirement. A utility permit was also requested to cross 14<sup>th</sup> Ave N with the line. A motion was made by Bryan and seconded by Boutilier to approve the variance, CUP and utility permits. Motion carried unanimously.

A motion was made by Bruner and seconded by Haman to enter into a funding agreement with the state for the 2019-2021 biennium to receive reimbursement for providing clerk services. Motion carried unanimously.

A motion was made by Medalen and seconded by Haman to not enter into a lease agreement with Gooseneck Implement for a tractor for mowing county ditches and to use the county tractor. Commissioners Medalen and Haman aye. Commissioners Bruner and Boutilier nay. Motion failed.

Cliff Hanretty met with the board to discuss his concerns with the Eaton Irrigation Board.

Correspondence was received from the NDDOT requesting authorization to extend the inspection cycle from 24 months to 48 months for reinforced concrete box culverts on the local system. A motion was made by Boutilier and seconded by Bruner to approve this request. Motion carried unanimously.

A motion was made by Bruner and seconded by Haman to appoint Roger Myers to the zoning board. Motion carried unanimously.

A motion was made by Boutilier and seconded by Bruner to appoint Nancy Mueller to the zoning board. Motion carried unanimously.

A motion was made by Bruner and seconded by Haman to appoint Terry Krumwiede to the water board. Motion carried unanimously.

Bottineau County requested financial assistance to install a box culvert on the East side of Section 6 in Pratt Township. A motion was made by Medalen and seconded by Haman to deny assistance due to lack of funds. Motion carried unanimously.

The auditor requested the authorization to accept donated sick leave for an employee who has met the criteria for this policy. A motion was made by Boutilier and seconded by Haman to approve the request. Motion carried unanimously.

Stacey Schmitt joined the meeting to get the board's thoughts on her time spent working in the Tax Director's office.

The board recessed for lunch.

Brent Bogard with LoadPass met with the board by phone to explain the online overweight permit system being offered to counties throughout the state. A motion was made by Boutilier and seconded by Bruner to try it for one year. Motion carried unanimously.

Stacey Schmitt and Dani Haman joined the meeting to discuss assessor certification and the possibility of Dani getting certified.

A consent motion was made by Boutilier and seconded by Bruner to approve the following: Treasurer's Miscellaneous Receipts #42376-42435; the monthly payroll in the amount of \$\$149,841.49 paid by warrant checks #24135 – 24196 and Social Service bills totaling \$4,387.24; Clerk of Court Feb County fees \$543.83, State fees \$10,367.75, Upham City \$40.00; County Recorder February recording fees of \$6,929.00 and misc fees of \$1,821.20; Sheriff's February statement of fees \$527.88, Sheriffs mileage \$236.50; Deputy reports for Jan/Feb.

The board continued to audit bills until completed. A motion was made by Bruner and seconded by Haman that the following bills be approved and the proper checks be issued thereof:
