OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS OF THE MCHENRY COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

June 4, 2024 9:00 AM

Chairman Nelson called the meeting to order. Commissioners Bryan Bruner, Brady Nelson, Duane Drader, Lance Johnson and Armann Anderson present.

A motion was made by Johnson and seconded by Anderson to approve the May 7th minutes. Motion carried unanimously.

Brad Feist met with the board to request an approach along the county road East of Velva. The approach would be 260' from an existing driveway. A motion was made by Anderson and seconded by Bruner to approve the request. Motion carried unanimously. A culvert will need to be installed and Velva City must also be notified since it is located within ½ mile of city limits.

A motion was made by Drader and seconded by Bruner to accept the estimate from Gladen Construction to repair the culvert south of the first bridge on the county road North of Granville. Motion carried unanimously.

A motion was made by Bruner and seconded by Anderson to amend the Recorder's budget to allow for the purchase of a pallet of copy paper. Motion carried unanimously.

A motion was made by Drader and seconded by Anderson to use funds in the Legacy Fund, LATCF and Road and Bridge to buy out the lease on two motorgraders. Motion carried unanimously.

BCI agents Matt Schimetz and Steve Yopen, along with Trey Skager met with the board. Schimetz explained the proposal for a regional drug task force to cover the counties of McHenry, Pierce, Rolette and Bottineau which will focus on targeted drug investigations. Although no contribution expectation was mentioned, Skager stated he plans to include \$30,000 in his 2025 budget for this purpose. Schimetz will provide a copy of the joint powers agreement for board review prior to a decision.

Gallagher representatives reviewed the results of the compensation plan and the various options for the board to consider. The board will discuss this later.

No bids were received for the mobile home in Upham.

Paul Thomas stopped by and met with the board. He discussed some concerns with the National Flood Insurance Program and the need for additional infrastructure funding in the upcoming legislative session.

The board recessed for lunch.

The board discussed the options in the compensation plan as reviewed earlier in the meeting. A motion was made by Anderson and seconded by Johnson to approve Option 1. Motion carried unanimously.

Assessor Doris Holen joined the meeting as well as Tax Director, Kristi Brodehl.

A motion was made by Anderson and seconded by Bruner to recess as a Board of Commissioners and reorganize as a Board of Equalization. Motion carried unanimously.

The board reviewed the city assessments. A motion was made by Anderson and seconded by Drader to approve the city assessments except for Bergen City as some changes were made after the city equalization meeting. Motion carried unanimously.

The board reviewed the township assessments. A motion was made by Drader and seconded by Johnson to approve the township assessments as presented except for the various townships where changes were made to the assessment after the township met. Motion carried unanimously.

The board reviewed the assessor adjustments to the following Bergen City parcels made after the city equalization meeting: parcel 64-1-12657 increased lot value of \$1,600, parcel 64-1-12698-2 increased lot value of \$900 and RS value of \$40,300, parcel 64-1-12705 increased lot value of \$880 and RS value of \$6,000, parcel 64-1-12706 increased lot value of \$1,760 and RS value of 6,200, parcel 64-1-12707 lot value increase of \$3,200 and RS increase OF \$47,100. A motion was made by Johnson and seconded by Bruner to approve the changes to the city assessments as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

The board reviewed the following assessor adjustments made after the township equalization meetings: parcel 14-2836-2 from ag to residential, parcel 14-2771-2 had RS increase of \$13,000, parcel 19-3611-2 from ag to residential, parcel 20-3933-3 had CL increase of \$6,000 and CS of \$32,500, parcel 20-3933-4 had a RL increase of \$2,500 and RS increase of \$13,700, parcel 20-3806-2 had a CL increase of \$6,000 and CS increase of \$47,600, parcel 25-4001-5130 had a RL increase of \$600 and RS increase of \$31,100, parcel 25-4938-2 had an RS increase of \$231,700, parcel 33-6617-2 had a RL increase of \$6,000 and RS increase of \$48,000, parcel 46-9110 had a RL increase of \$6,000 and RS increase of \$23,300, parcel 46-9085-2 had an RS increase of \$39,500, parcel 50-9697 had a RL increase of \$10,000 and RS increase of \$75,000, parcel 52-9932 had a RL increase of \$6,000 and RS increase of \$45,700, parcel 53-10084 had an RS increase of \$26,500, parcel 58-6-11833 had a CS increase of \$6,000, parcel 61-1-12268 had an RS increase of \$62,400. A motion was made by Bruner and seconded by Anderson to approve the changes to the townships assessments as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

The board reviewed the following Homestead Credits received after the cities met: 54-5-10440 and 63-3-12579. The board also reviewed the Veteran Credit on parcel 54-4-10354. A motion was made by Johnson and seconded by Anderson to approve the HC and VC applications. Motion carried unanimously.

A motion was made by Anderson and seconded by Drader to keep the ag land values at the same level as 2023. Motion carried unanimously.

A motion was made by Johnson and seconded by Bruner to approve the tax exemptions for the Souris Valley Care Center and the Diocese of Fargo properties. Motion carried unanimously.

A motion was made by Bruner and seconded by Anderson to recess as a Board of Equalization and reorganize as a Board of Review for the unorganized townships. Motion carried unanimously. The board reviewed the assessments, farm residence exemptions, veteran's credit and homestead credits for the unorganized townships. A motion was made by Drader and seconded by Anderson to approve the changes as presented. Motion carried unanimously. A motion was made by Anderson and seconded by Bruner to approve the FRE's, VC's and homestead credits. Motion carried unanimously. The board reviewed an application for inundated land for parcel 42-8454. A motion was made by Drader and seconded by Bruner to deny the application as the aerial pictures indicate the water is drying up. Motion carried unanimously.

A motion was made by Johnson and seconded by Drader to adjourn as a Board of Review and reorganize as a Board of Equalization. Motion carried unanimously. A motion was made by Anderson and seconded by Johnson to accept the changes for the unorganized townships. Motion carried unanimously. A motion was made by Bruner and seconded by Johnson to adjourn as a Board of Equalization and reconvene as a Board of Commissioners. Motion carried unanimously.

A motion was made by Johnson and seconded by Drader to contract with Doris Holen to complete the 2024 assessments for the unorganized townships.

A motion was made by Nelson and seconded by Bruner to change the millings price to \$5.00/ton if they load themselves or \$12.00/ton if the county loads them. Motion carried unanimously.

Bruner left the meeting.

The board discussed the implementation of the new compensation plan. A motion was made by Johnson and seconded by Anderson to implement Option 1 on July 1, 2024. Motion carried unanimously. Bruner absent.

Josh Frey, Miriam Smette and Trey Skager joined the meeting. Josh mentioned Miriam may start working part time and will be removing the legal assistant duties.

A consent motion was made by Anderson and seconded by Johnson to approve the following: Treasurer's Miscellaneous Receipts #48762-48886; the monthly payroll in the amount of \$148,699.92 paid by warrant checks #28116-28161; County Recorder May recording fees of \$3,429.00 and misc fees of \$640.49; Sheriff May statement of fees \$780.00, Sheriff mileage \$1,018.00.

The board continued to audit bills until completed. A motion was made by Anderson and seconded by Drader that the following bills be approved and the proper checks be issued thereof:
