OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS OF THE MCHENRY COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

March 5, 2024

9:00 AM

Chairman Nelson called the meeting to order. Commissioners Brady Nelson, Bryan Bruner, Duane Drader and Lance Johnson present. Commissioner Anderson absent.

A motion was made by Johnson and seconded by Drader to approve the February 6th and October 6th, 2023 minutes. Motion carried unanimously.

A motion was made to approve the utility permit for Verendrye Electric to bore under Co Rd 19 where it intersects with 19th Ave N. Motion carried unanimously.

A motion was made by Bruner and seconded by Drader to enter into a funding agreement with the state for the 2025-2027 biennium to receive reimbursement for providing clerk services. Motion carried unanimously.

A motion was made by Drader and seconded by Bruner to readvertise the bids for scrap iron. Motion carried unanimously.

Alex Kasowski met with the board regarding the weight limits on Co Rd 7. He stated they would be willing to pay overweight fees to allow them to haul 96,000 lbs. The board looked at alternate routes to get them to the state highway. No decisions were made.

Trey Skager, Dustin Welstad and Calise Linstrom met with the board on various items. Another table will be needed in the jury room, so one will be brought out of storage. Trey suggested the commissioners meet with the department heads every month. Trey mentioned the State Crime Bureau is researching the idea of forming a drug task force for the counties of Bottineau, McHenry, Pierce and Rolette counties. This would require the assignment of one deputy and one vehicle from each county. Trey also mentioned the Sheriff's department is pursuing purchasing a drone for approximately \$16,000 – \$20,000 and is in the process of applying for donations. The 'Back the Blue' appropriation was discussed, which is funding passed down from the State for the purpose of recruitment and retention. A payment schedule was presented by the Sheriff's Department. A motion was made by Johnson and seconded by Drader to pay each officer according to the schedule, in which payment will be made at the option of each officer either in December, January or a portion in each month. Motion carried unanimously. The board was also informed the State Academy is now requiring attendees to purchase uniform clothing for PT, which will increase the clothing costs for the county.

A mobile home in Upham was foreclosed by the county for delinquent taxes. A motion was made by Bruner and seconded by Drader to advertise the mobile home for sale on bids. Motion carried unanimously.

The board discussed the plans for an impounded vehicle sale. Dustin mentioned there have been additional cars placed in the lot so notices will need to be sent to those owners before they can be sold. A motion was made by Drader and seconded by Johnson to set the sale for June. Motion carried unanimously.

Calise mentioned the county is currently working on Stonegarden funding from FY22. The application for FY23 is in Washington being reviewed and FY24 was just submitted to Border Patrol. Included in the request for FY24 was a new car and an in-car video system.

The board reviewed the floodplain application from Enbridge to perform maintenance work on the pipeline located at Line 81, Milepost 121.759. A motion was made by Johnson and seconded by Drader to approve the permit. Motion carried unanimously.

A motion was made by Drader and seconded by Bruner to purchase 9 sets of oxygen/acetylene tanks from Praxair for the price quoted. Motion carried unanimously.

A motion was made by Johnson and seconded by Bruner to advertise for a 40' x 60' pole building to replace the Upham shop. Motion carried unanimously.

A consent motion was made by Johnson and seconded by Bruner to approve the following: Treasurer's Miscellaneous Receipts #48351-48452; the monthly payroll in the amount of \$135,766.82 paid by warrant checks #27985-28025; Clerk of Court February County fees \$604.50, State fees \$15,030.98; County Recorder February recording fees of \$2,687.00 and misc fees of \$397.07; Sheriff February statement of fees \$1,000.00, Sheriff mileage \$385.00; Deputy reports for Jan/Feb.

The board continued to audit bills until completed. A motion was made by Bruner and seconded by Drader that the following bills be approved and the proper checks be issued thereof:
