OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS OF THE MCHENRY COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

May 7, 2024

9:00 AM

Chairman Nelson called the meeting to order. Commissioners Brady Nelson, Bryan Bruner, Arman Anderson, Duane Drader and Lance Johnson present. Johnna Torr was also present.

A motion was made by Anderson and seconded by Drader to approve the April 2nd minutes. Motion carried unanimously.

A motion was made by Anderson and seconded by Johnson to approve the floodplain application from the Velva Wildlife Club to construct a pavilion in Outlot 594 of the NW ¼ NW ¼ in Sec 17-153-80. Motion carried unanimously.

A motion was made by Drader and seconded by Bruner to approve the raffle permit for the Towner Rodeo Association. Motion carried unanimously.

A motion was made by Johnson and seconded by Bruner to issue the proper deed to Justin and Shannon Hanson for the sale of county land described as the South 50' of the W ½ of Lot 8 Block 8 in the 2nd Addition to the City of Upham, and to cancel any remaining taxes. Motion carried unanimously.

A motion was made by Drader and seconded by Johnson to approve abatements 1576-1579. Motion carried unanimously.

The board reviewed the conditional use application from Knife River

A motion was made by Drader and seconded by Anderson to approve the special event permit for Finishline Burgers and Brew for an event at the Velva Wildlife Club on June 29th. Motion carried unanimously.

A motion was made by Bruner and seconded by Drader to enter into a funding agreement with the state for the 2025-2027 biennium to receive reimbursement for providing clerk services. Motion carried unanimously.

The Emergency Manager's quarterly report was presented to the board.

Representative Dick Anderson briefly met with the board and discussed road funding.

The board reviewed the plans for the new county shop in Upham. A motion was made by Johnson and seconded by Anderson to approve the following colors: white with brown trim, white doors and walls. Motion carried unanimously.

The board discussed the Granville cemetery funds. The City of Granville is working on correcting this.

Frank Anderson with RDO Equipment met with the board to discuss the upcoming blade lease expirations. The board requested buyout paperwork for their June meeting.

Chief Deputy, Dustin Welstad joined the meeting. The board discussed the abandoned vehicles and a motion was made by Bruner and seconded by Drader to hold the auction on June 5th at 9:00 AM. Motion carried unanimously. Welstad will provide a list of vehicles for advertising.

A motion was made by Drader and seconded by Johnson to advertise for a road maintenance employee, pending the outcome of the discussion with the current employee. Motion carried unanimously.

The board recessed for lunch.

Tom Alexander with the Minot Housing Authority met with the board regarding the option of turning the Pierce/McHenry Housing Authority over to Minot Housing Authority. One commissioner from each of the counties would be appointed to the Minot Housing Board. The housing vouchers could then be utilized across the three counties and not be restricted to a certain county. The board requested to have time to review the proposed agreement.

Johnna Torr joined the meeting.

A motion was made by Johnson and seconded by Drader to lift weight restrictions on all county and township roads, effective immediately. Motion carried unanimously.

The board reviewed the options received for updating the compensation plan. The board will request additional information and would like to meet with the Gallagher representatives again before making a decision.

A culvert is collapsed in Meadow Township. Commissioner Johnson will check on the size.

A consent motion was made by Anderson and seconded by Johnson to approve the following: Treasurer's Miscellaneous Receipts #48640-48761; the monthly payroll in the amount of \$145,918.39 paid by warrant checks #28071-28115; Clerk of Court April County fees \$570.00, State fees \$14,664.01, City of Velva 120.00; County Recorder April recording fees of \$5,718.00 and misc fees of \$313.68; Sheriff April statement of fees \$570.00, Sheriff mileage \$935.00, Deputy reports for March.

The board continued to audit bills until completed. A motion was made by Drader and seconded by Johnson that the following bills be approved and the proper checks be issued thereof:
